Read:

Matthew 10:29-31

Discuss:

1. What was your take away from Barton's story this week? How did it impact your life?
2. Why does Jesus use a sparrow as his illustration in Matthew 10:29? What is significant about a sparrow that makes it a perfect choice to illustrate Jesus' point?
3. Is there anything in our lives outside the realm of God's concern or care? Is anything in our lives too mundane or inappropriate to talk to God about?
4. What does Jesus's teaching in Matthew 10:29-31 teach us about God's concern for all creation? How should we practically embody God's care for the creation?
5. What will you do differently because of Barton's story and Jesus' teaching? How does this week's talk help you think about life differently?
