

## Talk It Over

Questions are prepared each week by the teaching pastor and are designed to prompt insights, questions, and the life experience of each listener. If these are used in a group immediately following the talk, it would be much the same as what was done in Israel at the time of the early church. They will also be useful to individuals who want a deeper understanding of the message.

You don't need to answer all of the questions. Choose one or several to think about on your own or to discuss if you are meeting in a group.

## **UNLIMITED LOVE**

- 1. How does Jesus' treatment of Judas, despite knowing his future betrayal, challenge traditional notions of love and forgiveness?
- 2. How does the narrative of Judas Iscariot illustrate the concept of blurred lines between temptation and action, and its consequences?



- 3. Reflect on a time when you've experienced blurred lines between temptation and action in your own life. How did you navigate this situation, and what did you learn from it?
- 4. Evaluate your own tendencies towards greed or selfishness, especially in contexts where you've been entrusted with responsibilities or resources. How can you guard against succumbing to these temptations, drawing from Jesus' interactions with Judas?
- 5. Consider incorporating a daily rhythm of confession and reflection into your spiritual practice, as suggested in the text. How might this practice deepen your relationship with God and help you align your life more closely with the teachings of Jesus?
